CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

RESTRICTIONS:

The system does not save any unpaid entries. All owners & Riders must be members of, and all horses/ponies must be registered with the discipline in which they wish to compete as well as a Club in their Province. The organising committee in consultation with the discipline Representative reserves the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the classes be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions.

PRIZEMONEY:

A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for CSN (Open) classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Provincial (Novice) classes plus sponsorship per class.

SUBSTITUTIONS:

A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.

DRESS:

Jackets Only. Competitors are required to be correctly dressed at all times. No Provincial or other T/Golf Shirts will be allowed. No Dressage waistcoats will be permitted.

STABLING:**R200 per day/night**

Initial bedding is included. Additional bedding will be available at the show office for the competitor's own account. **NO PADDOCKS ALLOWED AT ALL**

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the STABLE BOOKING FORM

Parades & Displays:

Except in circumstances where special dispensation has been obtained from the Show Director, competitors must take part in any parade or display or Prize giving. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of any Prizemoney, Grading/Qualification Points and/or Trophies.

ACCESS:

As per COVID-19 regulations regarding spectators. All accessing the premises must register their attendance list and ShowWave COVID-19 declaration on the links that will be provided after closing date of entries. A QR code received from ShowWave must be presented at the

gate for access every day for the duration of the Easter Festival Please note that a new QR code must be presented for each show. All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

Competition Rules: Unless otherwise stated, all classes will be run under the applicable FEI, and/or specific discipline rule.
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event. All horses competing in FEI Classes must have FEI passports or FEI Recognition cards and must be registered with the FEI for 2020 Horse Registrations.

AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
- 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza.
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination. In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.
3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course. All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

4. Booster Vaccinations

a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.

b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

Equine Influenza Vaccination Requirements

Vaccination	Protocol	Eligibility to Enter Venue
Primary Course	I. 1st Vaccination: day 0 (e.g.1 March 2014).	Horses that have only received the first vaccination of the primary course are not allowed to compete or enter the FEI stables.
	II. 2nd Vaccination: day 21-92 (e.g.1 April 2014).	Horses that have received the primary course can compete provided that the vaccine has not been given within 7 days of arriving at an event venue
First Booster	Within 7 months of the 2nd vaccination of the Primary Course (e.g. 1 October 2014).	Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course Horses that received their primary course before 2005 are exempt from the first booster requirement within 7 months. Subsequent boosters are to be given at intervals of no later than 1 calendar year after the primary course. Horses can compete for up to 6 months +21 days after the 2nd vaccination of the Primary Course, however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue. (e.g. may enter venue after 8 October 2014)
Subsequent Boosters	III. MINIMUM: within one year of previous booster vaccination. COMPETING: must usually be in the 6 months +21 days of previous booster vaccination.	Horses must have been vaccinated to comply with the requirements for the Primary Course, First Booster and all subsequent boosters. Horses must have been vaccinated within 6 months +21 days of arriving at the Event however they cannot compete if they have been vaccinated within 7 days of arriving at an event venue.

As per SASA General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

CSI Events: The Rand Equivalent of CHF150

FEI Tribunal: The Rand Equivalent of CHF500

NOTES:

1. All SASA, SAEF and FEI rules, where applicable, shall apply.
2. The organisers reserve the right to cancel, combine, handicap and restrict classes.
3. Telephonic, or emailed entries unaccompanied by the correct entry fees will NOT be accepted.
4. All dogs must be on handheld leads, failure to which a spot fine of R1000 may be incurred
5. Catering will be available.

ENTRY FEE: R400per class. (Entry fees include R37.50 SASA Levy, R6.00 EDTS & R20.75 Medical/Security Levy, R50 Officials Levy (Excluding 15% VAT) and R64.98 KPC Levy Inc. VAT

NON-KPC Members pay R400 temp membership per rider.

This show will be run under COVID-19 regulations.

1. All riders, officials, staff, support staff and medics agree and confirm to comply with the S.A Government and SAEF Covid-19 guidelines and protocols as set out on the SAEF website, www.saeef.org.za when entering a show/event.
2. A rider may only be accompanied by the driver trucking the horse and a groom. Where the rider is trucking the horse themselves, then only the groom may accompany the rider. Where necessary additional groom/s to attended horse/s. In the case of underage riders, they may be accompanied by a maximum of plus 2 (i.e., Parent, Coach, Owner)
3. All attendees will be obliged to report to the COVID 19 Officer/employee, upon entry of the premises to sign the register, sanitise their hands, and have their temperature taken and recorded. The name of the Compliance Officer will be indicated on the schedule. Show holding bodies to get clearance and permission from the Compliance Officer to add their contact number to the schedule as well.
4. It is compulsory for all attendees to wear masks on the property at all times and adhere to social distancing protocols.
5. Prize Money will be done by Electronic EFT.
6. Although the Show holding Body has taken all necessary precautions to ensure compliance to Covid-19 protocols and guidelines as stipulated by the Department of Health, it is important to note that neither the Show holding Body, SASJ, nor SAEF can be held responsible for any person contracting COVID-19 at the said venue. All attendees are entering the venue at their own risk.
7. Should any attendee at the show contravene any of the Covid-19 regulations, then he/she will be asked by the Covid-19 Compliance Officer to leave the venue immediately. There will be no refunds for show entries.
8. Riders may warm-up and compete without a mask.

1. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses.
2. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website www.showingsa.co.za or from admin@showingsa.co.za. Temporary SASA membership (R90) will be allowed at this show.
3. SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in all classes. That includes In Hand and Under Saddle classes. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at www.showingsa.co.za or from admin@showingsa.co.za EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
4. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 8-12 fences, one of which will be a combination.
5. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
6. The Organising Committee, in consultation with the SASA Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
7. All classes will be run under SASA Rules –22nd Edition (Effective 1st February 2022)
8. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.
9. Registered SASA Instructors will earn Victor Ludorum points for pupils.
10. Adult & Junior Horses will not be ridden by the Judge, due to Covid 19 restrictions.
11. Heights of Horses must be stated on entry forms and in Horses passport.
12. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.
13. 59.2.1 All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website www.showingsa.co.za or from admin@showingsa.co.za
14. **Horses shall be registered with SAEF and SASA.**
15. **The horse and rider combination will compete as a member of the Province where the rider is resident.**
16. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in any of the showing classes if the horse has been ridden by anyone other than the competitor from the first day of the show.
17. A deposit of R20 for a number is included in the entry fee. This is refundable to all competitors on condition that the number is returned before the end of the show. Entry fees are not refundable.

Responsibility of Riders and Athletes

1. All competitors, judges and officials must be registered and paid up with SAEF.
2. All riders, judges, officials, support staff & medics agree & confirm that they will comply with the South African Government Regulations & SAEF Covid-19 guidelines & protocols, as issued by SAEF and set out on the SAEF website www.saef.org.za , when entering a show/event. All SAEF members are required to take personal responsibility for their own health, safety and wellbeing and the impact on others during the resumption of all equestrian training and competition activities. All SAEF members must comply with all SAEF COVID-19 requirements to participate in the resumption of equestrian training and competition activities
3. Riders may only be accompanied by their groom & a driver (only if needed). The driver of the vehicle must remain in /or near the vehicle for the duration of the show. Junior & Pony Riders (18 years & under) may be accompanied by one parent or guardian.
4. Coaches and/or officials may attend for work or generating an income.
5. All present at the Event will be required to report to the official Covid-19 Compliance Officer on arrival. This includes grooms, parents & riders. The register will be signed, Temperatures will be taken & recorded, Hand sanitizer will be provided. Only screening (taking of temperatures) is required, not testing (as in a Covid-19 official test). All individuals must complete and submit the SAEF Covid-19 Self Screening questionnaire and hand it over to the Covid-19 Compliance officer.
6. The name of the relevant Covid-19 Compliance Officer will be published on the entry form.
7. It is **COMPULSORY** for all present to wear face masks/covering, correctly positioned, at all times. When unmounted, all prescribed Covid-19 hygiene and physical distancing protocols must be maintained.
8. If you are or have experienced any of the following, it is your responsibility to declare to the designated COVID Compliance Officer if: you are experiencing flu-like symptoms, sore throat, loss of taste or smell, cough, shortness of breath or high temperature.
No person who is known to have been in contact with a Covid positive individual is allowed at a show/event. 10 Days quarantine is applicable as per Government regulations.
9. Riders do not have to wear masks in the warm-up arena and may compete without a mask. On Completion of the class/round, riders must return to their parking spot to untack, load and vacate the venue as soon as possible. A cool down period of 15 minutes is allowed, and the rider should then leave the premises as soon as possible afterwards.
10. Horseboxes & vehicles must adhere to the regulatory distance of 5m (five meters) apart, in demarcated parking areas.
11. No prize-giving will be held. All prize money will be paid electronically. A record of prize winners will be kept. Results will be posted online or provided by e mail. Rosettes may be placed in a designated area clearly marked for the riders' attention.
These may be collected by Riders, who are cautioned to wear masks and adhere to strict social distancing guidelines.
The designated area must be provided with hand sanitizer for recipients to use.
Riders are also requested not to gather at the collection point.
12. Horses will not be ridden by judges. Horses/Ponies may be stripped for the Conformation phase of the class. A groom may be permitted to enter the arena in order to assist the rider, when instructed by the Show Director/announcer.
When lined up, competitors must maintain a 2m distance between each other.

13. Spectators are permitted. 750 Indoors and 2000 spectators outdoors adhering to all safety protocols. (Social distancing of 1.5m, masks, etc.) All spectators must be fully vaccinated and must provide proof thereof. (Covid Vaccination Certificate).
14. The venues appointed Covid-19 Compliance Officer, is authorized to ask any person/ attendant at the venue to leave immediately, should any of the Covid-19 regulations be contravened. No refunds will be given for entries, levies or any other costs incurred.
15. Catering may be available, provided correct Covid-19 Rules are adhered to. No alcohol may be served at sporting events.
16. The Show holding body and venue has taken all & every precaution, ensuring Covid- 19 compliance. Please note however that the Show Holding Body (Venue), SASA & the South African Equestrian Federation (SAEF) cannot be held responsible for any person contracting Covid-19 at the respective venues.
