CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed as long as the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form. Please contact the OC before selling entries if there is a waiting list to fulfill first.

There will be no buying and selling of entries after **1st April 2023**. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.

REFUNDS: No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less payfast fees. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

RESTRICTIONS:

200 entries per day for the Bob Charter arena and 220 entries per arena per day for all other arenas.

Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for thus if the arenas are full, it will be added to the waiting list.

NOMINATIONS:

Declarations to be done by 12 noon on 5th April for Open PR & JR classes and on the 6th for Bob Charter adult classes

Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated on the SASJ Entry system.

YOU MAY NOT DO YOUR NOMINATIONS DURING HORSE INSPECTION.

Declarations on the system will close 30 min after the end of the last open nominating class on each day.

Adult 1.30m may not nominate up to a higher height division.

Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated on the SASJ entry system

ALL DECLARATIONS / NOMINATIONS MUST BE MADE BY THE OWNER OR RIDER ONLY ON THE SYSTEM. NO SMS nominations will be accepted.

PRIZEMONEY:

A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT for A 80cm – 1.20m, JR 80cm – 1.20m & PR 60cm – 1.00m classes plus sponsorship per class. **All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.**

SUBSTITUTIONS:

A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.

For provincial classes with Composite entry fee, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 4 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider need to be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry

of 4 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class.

For National classes a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, NO substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.

DRESS: Jackets Only.

STABLING: **R230 per day/night** Initial bedding is included. Additional bedding will be available at the show office for the competitor's own account. **Preference will be given to Neighbouring Group IX entries and Out of Province Entries.**
ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the STABLE BOOKING FORM

ACCESS: All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or SAEF Group IX Passports at all shows.

Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event.

AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

1 African Horse Sickness Zones

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
- 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
- 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
- 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.

5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.

No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

Equine Influenza (EI)

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

4. Booster Vaccinations

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

HORSE INSPECTION: Thursday 6th April 10am
 ALL Pony Rider Open Ponies (1.10m), Junior Open Horses (1.30m & 1.35m) & Adult Bob Charter Open Horses (1.35m, 1.40m & 1.50m). **A1.30m do not have a horse inspection.**

Competitors will be fined should there be any omissions or errors in the horse’s passport.

MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

PROTESTS & APPEALS:

As per General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

Rules, Regulations, Terms and Conditions applicable to all FEI, National & Provincial Classes

1. Competition Classes – All classes will be run under the applicable FEI Rule – unless otherwise stated a deviation to the SASJ Rule.
2. It is the Athletes/Owners responsibility to ensure that they comply with the control measures of African Horse Sickness and Equine Flu. Batch Numbers and dates of the last two vaccinations against Equine Influenza and AHS must be stated in the passport and signed and stamped by a registered veterinarian.
3. Vaccinations and Micro Chip Numbers must correspond with the information loaded on the SASJ Online System
4. Protests lodged must adhere to the General Regulations and SASJ Rules.
5. Registration of Horse/Pony and Rider with their Club, SASJ and SAEF must be in order on the SASJ Database.
6. All Athletes and Owners should be aware of the FEI Equine Prohibited Substances list of banned Substances and Controlled Medication as well South African Drug Free Sport and WADA Regulations and prohibited substances – All available on the various websites.
7. SASJ National Timing Equipment – is required for all National and FEI Events and is the responsibility of the OC to organize, collect and return the equipment.
8. Athletes are to ensure that any sponsored Saddlecloths or Athlete Wear they compete in during the event – that the Sponsors are registered with SASJ for the current year.
Athletes are also to ensure their logos comply with the FEI Sizes for Advertising – Article 256
9. Athletes are to ensure they are registered with a club, SASJ and SAEF.
10. PARADES - Except in circumstances where special dispensation has been obtained from the Show Director, competitors must take part in any parade or display or Prize giving. Failure to do so may result in forfeiture of any Prize money, Grading/Qualification Points and/or Trophies.
11. The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserves the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the classes be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.
12. The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, KPC, SANEC and any sponsors, the Organising Committee any and/or Officials shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever.
13. N.B: The OC, Venue, FEI, SAEF, SASJ, any officials, representatives, the Organising Committee or sponsors, shall in no way be held responsible for any loss, damage, theft or injury sustained by horses, riders, appointed officials, the public or their property at the show, caused by, or resulting from this show. *E&OE*
14. **Changes to Classes:** The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries. Open grade may be restricted to 220 horses. Recommended rounds per day will be in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and SASJ Rep. WE AIM TO HAVE A LIMIT OF 200 ENTRIES PER DAY PER ARENA. Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis.
The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserves the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where

necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the classes be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances.

15. The onus is on the competitor to check the programme when it is published on the website, and to ensure that their email address is updated with the SASJ office and to check the SASJ website/newsflashes for any changes to the schedule/programme. Any changes made to the programme once the final programme is published will be published on the SASJ website www.sashowjumping.co.za or sent out via newsflash.
16. SAEF (Previously SAEA) General Regulations apply – FEI General Regulations are applicable at FEI Events. FEI Veterinary Regulations will apply for all SASJ and FEI Events for Show Jumping in South Africa.
17. All stallions should have a yellow disc on both sides of the bridle or have a yellow ribbon in the tail.
18. No person OR company may conduct, promote, hand out, receive items OR payment that may constitute doing any form of business during the show.
19. Please keep Dogs on a handheld leash at all times – Failure to comply will incur a R1000 Spot fine OR NO DOGS ALLOWED.
20. Right of admission for any retailers/stall is reserved. Bookings must be made before the show.
21. Deduction from prize money: a DEDUCTION OF 15% will be made from all Open/CSN prize money awarded at this event. This amount will be paid to SASJ to be credited to the Showjumping Fund.
22. The starting order will be drawn according to FEI General Regulations.
23. Riders are requested to provide sleeping accommodation for their grooms as there are no facilities for this purpose. Please note that the lighting of fires or smoking in the stable areas is strictly forbidden. Kindly inform your grooms. Ablutions are available in the stable area for grooms. There are electricity outlets at the stable area.
24. Water is precious – please be aware of water wastage and help us to conserve water where possible.
25. No person OR company may conduct, promote, hand out, receive items OR payment that may constitute doing any form of business during the show. Right of admission for any retailers/stalls is reserved. Bookings must be made before the show.
26. No temporary electronic paddocks may be erected as there is limited parking space, FAILURE TO COMPLY WILL INCUR A R1000 FINE. Please use the Lunge arenas to lunge horses. Use of arenas other than those demarcated for the use of the show is strictly prohibited and will be under penalty of disqualification. The use of any area sign posted as not demarcated for this show is also strictly prohibited.
27. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONIES: Only the top 6 prize winners will enter the arena for the prize giving.
28. All competitors entered are obliged to compete in all competitions for which they have qualified unless they have special dispensation from the show director. Such dispensation will normally only be given where a Veterinary or medical certificate is submitted.

QUALIFICATION

Adult Open 1.35 Championship

Open to top 32 qualifiers

Top 32 Horses from classes 103.1 & 103.2 to qualify for the 1.35m Championship, qualifying points to be awarded in the qualifying competitions. e.g., 50, 47, 45, 44 etc.

Should you not qualify for the Adult SA Grand Prix, and you have not ridden and completed a round in any of the 1.35m classes qualifying, you may not compete in the 1.35m Championship class (even though there aren't 32 riders in the A1.35m championship class), but you may opt to ride in the Open consolation class in the Peter Minnie Arena.

Adult Open 1.40 Championship

Open to top 32 qualifiers

SECTION 2 SOUTH AFRICAN OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX

THE SASJ NATIONAL SENIOR, YOUNG RIDER, JUNIOR, U25 AND PONY RIDERS' OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX EVENTS

1. CLASSIFICATION

Only the 5 (Five) competitions approved and authorised by SASJ as such shall be the official National Grand Prix Titles for SA Show Jumping, all hereinafter referred to as to the Grand Prix unless referred to by the below names:

- * SASJ Senior National Outdoor Grand Prix
- * SASJ Junior National Outdoor Grand Prix
- * SASJ Pony Rider National Outdoor Grand Prix
- * SASJ Young Rider National Outdoor Grand Prix
- * SASJ U25 National Outdoor Grand Prix

and no other competition held in the area of jurisdiction of SASJ and called a "Grand Prix" may use the additional words "of South Africa" or any similar wording. These competitions must be staged outdoors and in daylight.

2. Allocation

- 2.1 Each Outdoor Grand Prix shall be staged only once in any one calendar year and shall only be staged at CSN Events.
- 2.2 All Outdoor Grand Prix's shall be allocated to Provinces by SASJ, and no Outdoor Grand Prix shall be allocated unless SASJ is satisfied that the required standards will be upheld at the event.

3 Application to Host

- 3.1 PEEXCO having been allocated Outdoor Grand Prix shall as soon as possible thereafter notify the SASJ National Office of proposals. Timeously completed SLA's need to be received by the 1st of September each year.

- The Name of the Event.
- The Venue
- The Address of the OC and Show Secretary.
- The Dates and Length of the Event.
- The Proposed prize money and/or other awards offered for the outdoor Grand prix classes.
- The position that the outdoor Grand prix class/es would occupy on the programme.

- 3.2 SASJ in allocating each outdoor Grand prix must ensure that the following facilities are available:

- Satisfactory stabling.
- Adequate spectator and catering facilities.
- Adequate facilities for Athletes and grooms.

Adequate equipment necessary to hold competitions of Outdoor Grand prix standard and to satisfy the Sponsors requirements regarding the venue, Arena Surface, choice of suitable dates, programme, presentation, organisation, production etc.

Adequate arenas and practice areas

- 3.3 A SA Outdoor Grand Prix shall not be advertised or staged until the OC of the event at which it is to be staged has received permission in writing from SASJ.

4 Requirements

- 4.1 Notification of date.

The SASJ Office shall notify Council the OC of Outdoor Grand Prix, of the date and duration of the Outdoor Grand prix at least three months prior to that date, and it must be published on the National Calendar, the OC concerned shall send copies of the approved schedule to the SASJ National Office at least two months before the closing date of entries.

- 4.2 The schedule and programme/catalogue must state clearly that the outdoor Grand prix is being staged under the authority of SASJ.

- 4.3 The Organising Committee is required to ensure that the following words appear in the schedule and in the programme for the Events beneath the description of all qualifying competitions.

"Recognised as a qualifying competition."

5 Eligibility of Athletes, Owners and Horses

5.1 Athletes and Owners and Horses

- 5.1.1 Eligibility of Athletes, Owners, and horses/ponies as per Appendix A, B & C
- 5.1.2 An Athlete and Horse/Pony combination are only eligible to compete in one Outdoor Grand Prix title in a calendar year. This does not include special competitions

5.2 Horses

- 5.2.1 Senior Outdoor Grand Prix's
Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries
Horses must be older than 7 years.
Height: 1.50m Speed; 375mpm
- 5.2.2 Junior Outdoor Grand Prix's
Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries
Horses must be older than 7 years.
Height: 1.35m Speed; 375mpm
- 5.2.3 Pony Outdoor Grand Prix's are restricted to Ponies as per Annexure A & C
Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries
SASJ Ponies heights apply and must be 6 years or older.
Height: 1.20m Speed; 350mpm
- 5.2.4 SASJ Young Rider Outdoor Grand Prix's
Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries
As per FEI Jumping Rules Annex IX – Chapter I – Article
Height: 1.40m Speed; 375mpm
- 5.2.5 U25 Outdoor Grand Prix's
Horses must be registered with SASJ at the closing date of Entries
As per FEI Jumping Rules Annex IX – Chapter I – Article

6 Floating Trophies

- 6.1 All outdoor Grand prix floating trophies remain the property of SASJ and shall not be handed over to the winners of an outdoor Grand prix.
- 6.2 The OC under whose auspice The Outdoor Grand Prix is staged shall be responsible for the collection from and safe return of floating trophies to SASJ, as soon as possible after the event.
- 6.3 The OC under whose auspice The Outdoor Grand Prix is staged is also responsible to make good any damage to any trophy and to replace any trophy not returned to SASJ.

7 Medals

Medals shall be provided by SASJ and shall be awarded to:

SASJ Outdoor Grand Prix Medals

Gold	First Placed Individual
Silver	Second Placed Individual
Bronze	Third Placed Individual

8 Prize Giving Protocol

The SASJ Floating Trophy, Medals and Mementos should where possible be awarded by:

Trophy

The Sponsor of the Class, or if not available,
The President of the Ground Jury

Medals

The President or Vice President of EXCO, or if not available.
The Chairman of the OC, or if not available.
The SASJ Representative/Technical Delegate/Member of SASJ Exco

Mementos

The sponsor of the class or if not available,
The Chairman or nominee of the Organising Committee

9 Entries

- 9.1 The Outdoor Grand Prix shall not be classified as official, nor the trophies and medals awarded, unless there are at least 10 (ten) starters in each of the qualifying competitions. Application may be made to SASJ Executive to waive this rule.
- 9.2 The OC may at their discretion allow buying and selling of entries for The Outdoor Grand Prix up to 12H00 the day before the start of the show.
- 9.3 Substitutions of horses will not be allowed after the Veterinary Inspection has taken place.
- 9.4 An entry shall be one horse and rider combination.

10 Order and Conditions of Classes.

- 10.1 It is compulsory for all qualifying competitions preceding outdoor Grand prix to be held in the order stated in the rules or schedule.
- 10.2 All Outdoor Grand Prix's shall be held in daylight, unless the night lighting provided at the venue is approved by the **SASJ Representative** in conjunction with the President of the Ground Jury, the OC, and the Course Designer, as being of a sufficiently high standard to permit one or more of the qualifying competitions to be staged at night.

11 Order of Starting

- 11.1 In the qualifying competitions, the order of starting shall be determined in accordance with FEI Art 252.
- 11.2 In the Outdoor Grand Prix competition the order of starting shall be in ascending order of points gained in the qualifying competitions. (Reverse order of merit).
- 11.3 Where possible a gap of at least **10**(ten) horses shall be allowed between horses ridden by the same Athlete. This shall be achieved by moving that Athlete's first horse upwards in the order of riding.
- 11.4 Where there is equality of points among the horses qualified, the horses will compete in the same order relative to each other as they did in the last qualifying competition.

12. THE QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS

The qualification for the Outdoor Grand Prix shall be as follows.

- 12.1. There will be **2**(two) classes.
 - a. Welcome A 2 Competition FEI Article 238 2.1 – qualifying class
 - b. Competition FEI Article 238 2.2 – qualifying class.
- 12.2. To compete in the championship horse and athlete combinations must complete at least one of the qualifying classes.
- 12.3. The qualifying for the top **30** (thirty) ranked combinations per class.
 - 12.3.1 In all qualifying competitions irrespective of the number of starters, the competitor placed first receives 50 points, the second receives 47 points, the third receives 45 points, and the fourth received 44 points and so on reducing by one point per place.
 - 12.3.2 In the case of ties for any place in any of the qualifying competitions, the competitors that tie shall each receive the full point's entitlement or that place that they would have received had there been no tie.
 - 12.3.3 There will be two qualifying competitions preceding the S A Outdoor Grand prix, both scores will be counted towards the S A OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX qualifications.
 - 12.3.4 Competitors who retired or are eliminated in the first round of a competition receive no points.
 - 12.3.5 The Organising Committee is required to ensure that no more than one qualifying competition take place each day.
 - 12.3.6 No Athlete is permitted to ride more than two horses in the S A outdoor Prix class. In the event of an Athlete qualifying more than two horses, the Organising Committee shall, immediately the final list of qualifiers is known, obtain the Athlete's decision as to which two horses that Athlete intends to ride in the S A OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX Class.
 - 12.3.7 In the event of a withdrawal of any of the qualified horses, additional horses may, at the discretion of the PGJ and the SASJ Representative, be introduced in order of merit into the S A OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX Class to maintain the number qualified.
 - 12.3.8 No Wild cards for SA OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX will be permitted.
 - 12.3.9 The Previous year's horse /rider combinations winners automatically qualify for the S A OUTDOOR GRAND PRIX - Should this combination fall within the top 30 qualified there will not be an additional starter. The horse/rider combination still need to have completed one of the qualifying competitions.

- 12.4 In the Grand Prix the order of starting shall be in ascending order of points gained in the qualifying competitions in reverse order of merit.
- 12.5 The Organising Committee is required to ensure that the following words appear in the schedule and in the programme for the Events beneath the description of all qualifying competitions. "Recognised as a qualifying competition."
- 12.6 In the event of it not being possible to determine exactly the best 30 qualified horses, due to a points total producing a tie or a late withdrawal of an Athlete, it shall be the responsibility of the PGJ and the SASJ Technical Delegate at the Event, to authorise either an increase or a decrease in the number of Athletes that may take part in the Championship Class. Under no circumstances, however, shall one Athlete be permitted to ride more than two horses.
- 12.7 The Organising Committee shall ensure that a list of qualifying points of all horses, together with the order of riding for the qualified horses, is posted up or made available within one hour of the completion of the last qualifying competition.
- 12.8 No entry, fee may be charged for the Championship Class itself. Organising Committees may however charge a starting fee which will include the SASJ Levy.
- 12.9 Once the first qualifying competition of the Championship has started no substitution of Horse, is permitted for the Championship Class itself. However, in the qualifying competitions themselves, as individual competitions, substitutions of rider will be permitted.
- 12.10 SASJ Electronic Timing, approved by EXCO, incorporating a displayed countdown facility, is obligatory for all qualifying classes and the Championship Class.

13 THE GRAND PRIX CLASS

- 13.1 This class shall be conducted according to the following formula:
FEI Art 273.1
FEI Art 273.3.4.1
FEI Art 273.4.4
- 13.2 The first round shall be over a Grand Prix type course consisting of between ten and twelve numbered obstacles and shall include two doubles and one treble combination, and, if possible, include a water jump.
- 13.3 The second round shall be over a course consisting of 8 (eight) obstacles and shall include (one) double combination.
- 13.4 273.4.4. The classification will be established according to the Penalties and time in the jump-off. Classification of Athletes not qualified for the jump-off will be according to aggregate Penalties over both rounds and the time incurred in the second round. Classification of Athletes not qualified for the second round will be according to Penalties and time in the first round (if the first round is against the clock) or according to Penalties in the first round (if the first round is not against the clock)
