**CODE OF CONDUCT**

**FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE**

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

**REFUNDS:** No Refunds will be given after closing date of entries. Entries withdrawn before close of date will be refunded less Payfast fees. However due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate cancelling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

**ENTRY FEE:** R500 per Class (incl. R64.98 KPC Arena Levy, R6.00 EDTS Levy, R40 SASA Levy, R50 Officials fee, R23.65 Paramedics/Security)

**TEMP. MEMBERSHIP:** There will be a temporary membership arena fee of R150 for competitors not a member of Kyalami Park Club. This is to be paid once per rider. If Entering Jumping please pay the temp membership with your jumping entries and then when entering the showing, you may declare that you are a member as you would have paid the temp membership already.

**PRIZEMONEY:** A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for open classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT Novice plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC.

**SUBSTITUTIONS:** A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider and should be done no later than 30minutes before the start of the class

**DRESS:** Jackets Only

**STABLING:** Stabling will be available at **R230 per day/night OR R1100 for the duration of the show (27 June – 2 July)**. Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis, should you require to be stabled together with another rider please send the booking forms together as stabling is allocated immediately upon receipt. Initial bedding will be provided. **PLEASE NOTE THAT YOU MAY NOT ARRIVE BEFORE THE DATE YOU STIPULATED ON YOUR BOOKING FORM AS ARRIVAL DATE.**

**NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED ON THE VENUE**

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag.

The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show director.

Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.

Stables will be allocated to out of Province rider first, on a first come first paid basis.

Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their stable booking form, however, please bear in mind that if the person you are wanting to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis.

The grooms are encouraged to hand walk horses.

**GALA EVENING:** Details will be sent out.

**GROOMS MEALS:** Can be purchased at the Kiosk

**ACCESS:** **ACCESS THROUGH THE MAIN KPC GATE:** All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided. Cars not towing horse boxes may come in through the Lipizzaner Road gate.

**PASSPORTS:** All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling and random passport checks, may take place at any event.

## **AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS**

### **1 African Horse Sickness (AHS)**

African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa; therefore, any suspicion of a clinical case of AHS anywhere in the country must be reported to the local State Veterinarian immediately.

Symptoms of AHS include high temperature, rapid breathing, coughing followed by a frothy fluid from the nostrils and death within a few hours. In less acute cases, swelling of the neck and head particularly above the eyes and redness of the mucous membranes.

#### **1 African Horse Sickness Zones**

The Republic of South Africa has been divided into four zones, namely:

- 1 AHS Free Zone
- 2 AHS Surveillance Zone
- 3 AHS Protection Zone
- 4 AHS Infected Zone.

All Equines in South Africa except in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones are required to be vaccinated against AHS annually, with an effective remedy registered in section 1, of Act 101 of 1965.

Equines residing in the AHS Free and AHS Surveillance Zones require permission from the State Directorate for vaccination against AHS.

All equines residing in the AHS Protection and Infected Zones must be vaccinated annually against AHS.

In the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zone vaccination is only allowed between 1st June and 31st October of each year.

Whilst it is not a requirement that horses in the AHS Infected Zone be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st October it has been strongly recommended.

Therefore, the SAEF AHS Vaccination Requirements are as follows:

- 1 All Equines competing in SAEF events are required to have an annual AHS vaccine with a vaccine registered under Act 101 of 1965. The vaccine consists of AHS 1 and AHS 2. The vaccine has to be administered by a registered Veterinarian, registered with the South African Veterinary Council with a minimum period of 21 days between the two vaccines.
  - 2 The Vaccine and batch number must be written in the appropriate vaccination page and signed and stamped by the Veterinarian administering the vaccine.
  - 3 Horses residing in the AHS Free, Surveillance and Protection Zones may only be vaccinated between 1st June and 31st of October each year.
  - 4 Horses that reside in the AHS Free and Surveillance Zones and participate in events in these Zones only are exempt from the necessity of annual AHS vaccination. However, if they wish to compete in the AHS Protection or AHS Infected Zones, they must be vaccinated.
  - 5 AHS vaccinations that are given with an interval of less than the minimum 21 days are null and void for both vaccinations and horses that have received such vaccinations will be deemed not to have been vaccinated.
- No horse may compete for 7 days following any vaccination.

### **Equine Influenza (EI)**

1. All Horses participating in SAEF Events must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza
2. An initial Primary Course of two vaccinations must be given; the second vaccination must be administered within 21-92 days of the first vaccination.

In completing the primary course of the vaccinations, the vaccine must be the same manufacturer for example you initially vaccinate with Proteq the second must be the same.

3. The First Booster must be given within 7 calendar months following the date of administration of the second vaccination of the primary Course.

All horses that were certified as correctly receiving the Primary Course prior to 1 January 2005 (under previous regulations), are not required to fulfill the requirement for the First Booster, providing there has been no lapse in their vaccination regime.

#### **4. Booster Vaccinations**

- a) The minimum booster frequency is every 12 months.
- b) However, for Horses competing, the last Booster must have been given within 6 months +21 days (and not within 7 days) before arrival at the Event.

### MEDICATION CONTROL:

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.  
Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

### PROTESTS & APPEALS:

As per General Regulations. All protests and Objections must be done in writing within the required timelines and in receipt of a R750 deposit.

## Team Entries:

Notice by Provinces of their intention to participate in Team Championships must be sent to the Show Secretary, in writing with a copy to SAEF & SASA (admin@showingsa.co.za), by no later 16<sup>th</sup> June 2023. Team nominations, on the prescribed forms, must be completed and received by the Show Secretary (copy to SAEF & SASA) by 21<sup>st</sup> June 2023 at 16h00. Each Province may only enter one team. All team entries must be entered in the individual classes for the discipline concerned.

For all other teams, the Team Managers must submit to the Show Secretary their final team selection from those nominated not later than 15:00 or such later time as the discipline Representative shall determine on the day preceding the start of the Team Championship concerned.

The draw for Team Championships will be done the day before each Championship at a time to be declared by the OC.

The rules governing the substitution of team horses and/or riders are laid down in in the relevant discipline rules and General Regulations. Should two or more Provincial Bodies be unable to compete in the National Team Championship in any discipline due to lack of competitors/horses of the required standard, then those Provincial Bodies may combine to send one team.

This team shall in all respects be deemed to be a team entered by a Province. **All team Athletes and Horses should be entered in the show and the onus is on the rider and province concerned to ensure that team entries are done prior to closing date of entries or arenas filling up.**

### SHOWING RULES:

1. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses
2. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za). No temporary SASA membership will be allowed at this show
3. SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in all classes. That includes In Hand and Under Saddle classes. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za) EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
4. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 8 - 12 fences, one of which will be a combination.
5. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
6. The Organising Committee, in consultation with the SASA Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
7. All classes will be run under SASA Rules Edition 23 Effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023
8. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.
9. Registered SASA Instructors will earn Victor Ludorum points for pupils.
10. Junior Horses will be ridden by the Judge.
11. Heights of Horses must be stated on entry forms and in Horses passport.
12. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.
13. QUALIFICATION OF HORSES – 59.3.1 In the Ault/Junior/Pony National Showing Team Championship, horses must be qualified by having been placed and received points, in at least one recognised show within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes as per rule 59.1.4. Being placed in a Novice Class may be considered as being qualified to compete at this level.
14. *The reserve horse that may be chosen, has to have been placed, with points, in at least one recognised show in at least one of the five classes (as per 59.1.4) in order for the horse to be eligible to be chosen as a reserve for the team.*
15. No cross entry of horse/rider combinations in the SA Team Championship and the Challenge Team Championship. A rider may compete in both, but on different horses.

16. In the Challenge Team Event it is preferable that horses have at least competed in a recognised showing class within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes. Competitors may only ride one horse in each class, except in the Working Classes, where they may ride up to three horses
17. All Riders and Horses must be registered with a Club, SAEF and SASA. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za). SAEF Day Membership fee R150. Once a rider has done more than two shows, then the rider must register online and become a full SAEF member. No temporary SASA membership will be allowed at this show
18. SASA will pay entry fees for SASA EDTS competitors in all classes. That includes In Hand and Under Saddle classes. The competitor must be an EDTS member of SASA. Membership is free. EDTS application forms, Rules and Conditions are available at [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za) EDTS competitors will earn EDTS Victor Ludorum points.
19. Working Hunters will be required to jump a course of approximately 6-8 fences, one of which will be a combination.
20. Should a competitor qualify more than one horse for the championship, he may nominate another rider, who must be a paid-up member of SASA, to show the horse in that championship. However, the competitor must do the individual test required in the Championship.
21. The Organising Committee, in consultation with the SASA Representative, reserves the right to cancel or combine classes.
22. All classes will be run under SASA Rules – 23rd Edition (Effective 1<sup>st</sup> January 2023).
23. EVERY COMPETITOR ENTERING THIS SHOW DOES HEREBY INDEMNIFY ANY JUDGE REGISTERED WITH SASA, OFFICIATING AT THIS SHOW, AGAINST ANY CLAIM OF ANY NATURE FROM ANY CAUSE WHATSOEVER.
24. Registered SASA Instructors will earn Victor Ludorum points for pupils.
25. Junior Horses will be ridden by the Judge.
26. Heights of Horses must be stated on entry forms and in Horses passport.
27. The minimum age of horses shown under saddle shall be 3 years.
28. QUALIFICATION OF HORSES – 59.3.1 In the Ault/Junior/Pony National Showing Team Championship, horses must be qualified by having been placed and received points, in at least one recognised show within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes as per rule 59.1.4. Being placed in a Novice Class may be considered as being qualified to compete at this level.
29. *The reserve horse that may be chosen, has to have been placed, with points, in at least one recognised show in at least one of the five classes (as per 59.1.4) in order for the horse to be eligible to be chosen as a reserve for the team.*
30. No cross entry of horse/rider combinations in the SA Team Championship and the Challenge Team Championship. A rider may compete in both, but on different horses.
31. In the Challenge Team Event it is preferable that horses have at least competed in a recognised showing class within the last 12 months, in their respective age categories and relevant classes. The Challenge Team Event is open to both Novice and Open horses/ponies.
32. 59.2.1 All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za)
- 33. Horses shall be registered with SAEF and SASA**
- 34. The horse and rider combination will compete as a member of the Province where the rider is resident.**
35. On no account, and under penalty of disqualification, may any horse take part in any of the showing classes if the horse has been ridden by anyone other than the competitor from the first day of the show.
36. A deposit of R20 for a number is included in the entry fee. This is refundable to all competitors on condition that the number is returned before the end of the show. Entry fees are not refundable.
37. Horses entered in the Inter Provincial team event have to be entered in either the Open or Novice classes
38. Horses entered in the Challenge team event have to be entered into either the open or novice classes.
39. The Challenge Team Event is open to both Novice and Open horses/ponies.
40. 59.2.1 All competitors, owners and sponsors shall be registered with a club in whose area of jurisdiction they have their principal place of residence, SAEF and SASA and shall be re-registered on 1 January each year. Membership forms may be obtained on the SASA website [www.showingsa.co.za](http://www.showingsa.co.za) or from [admin@showingsa.co.za](mailto:admin@showingsa.co.za)
