CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in International Equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses' welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health, before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the Event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper Veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia, and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

CLOSING DATE: Sunday 11 August 2024

Entries need to be done directly on the SASJ Online System and payment done via Payfast.

NO LATE ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED.

Entries accepted on the online system – should the show be oversubscribed the SASJ Online ranking system will be implemented with Rankings per province.

Bought and Sold Entries will be allowed as long as the correct documentation is submitted within the correct time frames and the original rider has signed the form.

There will be no buying and selling of entries after Sunday 25 August 2024. Forms received thereafter will not be accepted.

REFUNDS: No Refunds will be given after the closing date of entries. *Entries withdrawn before the close of the date will be refunded less Payfast fees.* However, due to inclement weather conditions or other unforeseen circumstances, should it necessitate canceling the show, 80% of the entry fee will be refunded.

Bank Details: **All entries are to be paid for online via Payfast. Unpaid entries will be automatically deleted and will not be restored should arenas be full**

ENTRY FEE: **R1600 Composite Entry (1.30m – 1.50m)** includes R75 per class SASJ Levy, R70 KPC arena fee, and R5.13 EDS Levy per class. R50 medical & security levy per class. Incl. 15% VAT). R50 officials levy per class, excl. VAT.
R1350 Composite Entry (0.80m – 1.20m) includes R55 per class SASJ Levy, R70 KPC arena fee per class, R5.13 EDS Levy, R50 medical & security levy per class & 15% VAT). R50 officials levy per class excl. VAT.

TEMP. MEMBERSHIP: As per SASJ Regulations there will be no temp membership for this show

RESTRICTIONS: **SA Champs - A competitor may only ride 3 – three horses in the first 2 Qualifiers, apart from the A1.50m SA Championship class where a rider may only compete a maximum of 2 horses if they have qualified.**
A horse may only compete in One class per day (National) and 2 classes per day (Provincial) with a maximum of 3 classes at the event, excluding the Open Team Event
220 horses per arena per day

Should your entry be deleted for non-payment, the entry will not be restored based on when it was initially done but will be based on when it was paid for thus if the arenas are full, it will be added to the waiting list.

NOMINATIONS: Declarations for Open classes (1.30m - 1.50m) taking place on the first day must be made online on the riders' profile via the nomination system by no later than 12h00 on Tuesday 27 August. **Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated on the SASJ Entry system.**

Declarations will close 30 min after the end of the last open class on each day.
Riders who fail to make this declaration in time will automatically be entered in the same class as indicated entered on the SASJ entry system.

QUALIFICATIONS: There will be **2(two) qualifying classes** for the Toyota SA Senior South African Show Jumping Championship.
a. A 2 Competition FEI Article 238 2.1 – qualifying class
b. Competition FEI Article 238 2.2 – qualifying class

SOUTH AFRICA SHOW JUMPING SCHEDULE – 2024

PRIZE MONEY: A minimum of 60% net of entry fees less levies and VAT for CSN classes plus sponsorship and 40% less levies and VAT for Provincial classes plus sponsorship per class. This excludes sponsorship money that will be independently allocated by the OC. **All CSN Jumping classes will be subject to a 15% deduction from prize money to be paid into the SASJ Riders Fund.**

Note for Riders: *It is the responsibility of the rider who is competing in more than one arena to notify and liaise with the judges box if they may compete out of order and where they may slot in.*
Riders are also to please notify the judges box or marshals if they are scratching from a class.

SUBSTITUTIONS: A substitution is a change of EITHER a horse or rider.
For provincial classes with Composite entry fee, should a horse need to be substituted it may be substituted ONCE per entry only (if a composite entry of 4 classes, only ONE change may be done). Should a rider need to be substituted and the entry consists of a composite entry of 4 classes, the rider may be changed more than once. All substitutions must be given to the show holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties, a minimum of 30 minutes before the start of the relevant class. For National classes, a substitution may only take place ONCE, before the horse inspection. Should there be NO horse inspection, a substitution may only take place ONCE, by midday on the day before the National classes start, thereafter, and NO substitutions will be permitted. All substitutions must be given to the Show Holder on the correct forms, signed by all the correct parties.

DRESS: Jackets Only Show

STABLING: Stabling will be available at **R230 per day/night OR R1100 for the duration of the show (27 August – 1 September). If stabling any days outside the composite stabling amount days, please and the daily rate for the additional days.** Stabling is limited and will be booked on a first come first serve basis, should you require to be stabled together with another rider please send the booking forms together as stabling is allocated immediately upon receipt. Initial bedding will be provided.

NO PADDOCKS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BE ERECTED ON THE VENUE

ALL COMPETITORS needing stabling MUST COMPLETE the Stable booking form and submit the booking before arriving at the show

Initial Bedding will be provided, additional bedding will be available to purchase at R30 per bag.

The allocation of stabling accommodation is carried out by the Show Director and under no circumstances may any competitor change his/her stabling accommodation or alter the stabling list without prior consultation with, and approval of, the Show Director.

Failure to comply could involve disqualification of the horse concerned.

Stables will be allocated to out-of-province riders first. Allocation will also be on a first come and first-paid basis.

Competitors wishing to be stabled with others should indicate this on their stable booking form, however, please bear in mind that if the person you want to be stabled with has booked early and you have booked late or vice versa this allocation may not be possible as stables are allocated strictly on a first booked and paid for basis.

The grooms are encouraged to hand-walk horses.

ACCESS: **Free to spectators.**
All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

ACCESS THROUGH THE MAIN KPC GATE: All horseboxes and floats must be parked in the allocated area provided.

ACCREDITATION: N/A

PASSPORTS: All horses must be in possession of their FEI Passports or Group IX Passports at all shows. Inspections, sampling, and random passport checks may take place at any event. All horses competing in FEI Classes must have FEI passports or FEI Recognition cards and must be registered with the FEI for 2022 Horse Registrations. N/A

'EQUINE TESTING

All horses or ponies competing at SASJ and/or FEI Events may be subject to sampling for the presence of Prohibited Substances in accordance with the Anti-Doping and Controlled Medication Regulations (EADCMRs). Horses or ponies may be selected for sampling in accordance with the obligatory testing, targeted or random sampling procedures.

MCP testing as per SAEF Regulations will be done by the appointed Testing Vet.

Laboratory: National Horse Racing Authority, Turffontein Racecourse, Turf Club Street.

FEI testing will be as per FEI regulations by an appointed FEI Testing vet and sent to the FEI Appointed Laboratory.

VACCINATIONS:

SOUTH AFRICAN EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS, EQUINE INFLUENZA & AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS.

HORSES' ELIGIBILITY TO COMPETE – SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS Article 1001 – Equine Identification

Horses or Ponies that do not have FEI Passports must have a SAEF Group IX Passport to compete in South Africa.

1. Person Responsible (PRs) must comply with the requirements for national and SAEF Passports, Recognition Cards and registration for Events as described in the General Regulations.

Summary of SAEF VETERINARY REGULATIONS - AHS and EQUINE FLU REGULATIONS

EQUINE INFLUENZA

All horses & Ponies competing at SAEF Events must have an Equine Influenza Vaccine within 6 months and 21 days of competition.

All horses must have had a PRIMARY Course of Equine Influenza (Only Exception are horses that have been vaccinated every year without a primary course since 2005)

VACCINE 1 (V1) First Vaccine of the Primary Course. Horse is Not eligible to compete.

VACCINE 2 (V2) First Booster. Administered between 21 – 92 days after V1.

(From 2024 it will be 21 days – 60 days)

<p>VACCINE 3 (V3)</p> <p>Thereafter, if the horse is not competing booster vaccines may be given every 12 months, BUT if the year is exceeded, a Primary course must be repeated.</p> <p>For competition purposes the horse must have an Equine Influenza vaccine with 6 months and 21 days of competition. EG your horse has had V1 – V3. You do not compete, but 10 months later you decide to enter a competition. Ensure that an Equine Influenza vaccine is administered, and your horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. It is not necessary to repeat the Primary Course if you have not exceeded a year.</p> <p>NB: NO HORSE MAY COMPETE FOR 7 DAYS FOLLOWING ANY VACCINATION</p> <p>AFRICAN HORSE SICKNESS (AHS)</p> <p>African Horse Sickness is a controlled disease in South Africa, and as such the State Veterinary Department must be notified of any positive cases. According to the Government “Animal Diseases Act 35 of 1984” all Equidae must be vaccinated against AHS annually, (except in the controlled AHS Zones of the Western Cape)</p> <p>The only vaccine currently registered in terms of Fertilizers, Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies and Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act no 36 of 47) for AHS and therefore the only efficient/effective remedy “as described above is the live virus vaccine produced by Onderstepoort Biological Products (OBP).</p> <p>For Competition purposes the following apply:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> i) Horses Must be vaccinated against AHS 1 & AHS2 once in a calendar year. (Exception is the Free & Surveillance zones of the AHS controlled area, who require written permission for vaccination from State Vet Boland ii) The only accepted registered vaccine for competition purposes is the OBP vaccine, in terms of the “Farm Feeds, Agricultural Remedies & Stock Remedies Act 1947 (Act 36 of 47). iii) AHS vaccines must be administered by a veterinarian, who is required to sign and stamp the passport. iv) Vaccines must be administered with a minimum of 3 weeks (21 days) apart. Vaccines given less than 3 weeks will invalidate both vaccines. (It has come to the notice of SAEF the growing number of horses that are receiving the second AHS vaccine within 15 to 20 days of the first. Not only is the horse ineligible to compete, but the welfare of the horse becomes compromised.) v) For competition purposes horses residing in the Free & Surveillance Zones of the Western Cape do not require AHS vaccine. However, should they leave the Free U Surveillance zones they will be required to have AHS vaccine, both for competition purposes and for movement back into the controlled area. vi) Vaccination is only allowed in the Controlled Zones, between 1st June and 31st October each year. Whilst it is strongly recommended that horses are not vaccinated during high midge prevalence, vaccination times are not legislated in the Infected zone. vii) Due to the shortage of AHS vaccine during 2022, the SAEF issued a dispensation for all competition horses. “For competition purposes horses must receive one AHS1 and one AHS 2 vaccine between 1st June 2022 and 30th June 2024. Check SAEF for any updates as they are closely monitoring the situation. <p>FEI REGULATIONS ON PASSPORTS (FEI GENERAL REGULATIONS ART. 137)</p> <p>For all issues relating to FEI Horse Passports/FEI Recognition Cards please contact your National Federation. All Horses competing at FEI Events must be registered with the FEI for the current year. FEI Passports or FEI Recognition Cards (for those Horses with a national passport approved by the FEI) are compulsory for FEI Events.</p> <p>FEI REGULATIONS ON EQUINE INFLUENZA (FEI VETERINARY REGULATIONS ART. 1003)</p> <p>Horses competing at FEI Events must comply with the requirements for Equine Influenza vaccination in accordance with the Veterinary Regulations. All FEI registered Horses intending to compete at FEI Events (including CIMs) must be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in accordance with these Veterinary Regulations. The exception being if the applicable domestic legislation prevents the use of Equine Influenza vaccines within the relevant territory.</p>	<p>Horse will be eligible to compete after 7 days. Second Booster of the PRIMARY Course administered within 6 months after V2.</p>

MICROCHIP NO's	<i>Microchip numbers must be in the horses passport and SASJ Online System</i>
LIABILITY	<i>The FEI, SASJ, SAEF, The OC/SHB, Venue, Officials and sponsors shall in no way be held responsible for any damage, loss, theft, or injury sustained by owners, riders, competitors, horses, members or the public or any other person or their property whatsoever. E&OE</i>
CHANGES TO CLASSES	<i>The organising committee in consultation with the SASJ Representative reserve the right to combine, handicap, divide or cancel classes should this be necessary, always provided such amendments are not in conflict with the rules. Where necessary, classes may be restricted to qualifications. 80% of entry fees will be refunded should the class/s be cancelled due to inclement weather conditions or unforeseen circumstances. The organising committee reserves the right to cancel, combine, limit, or divide classes or change arenas. Lower grade/provincial entries may be restricted, or classes cancelled, depending on number of entries. Recommended rounds per day will be in consultation with the President of the Ground Jury and SASJ Rep. Any classes that are combined will be on a handicap basis. Changes made at/during the show will be at the SHB's discretion in consultation with the Ground Jury. This also applies to adverse weather conditions. Entry Fees will not be refunded to any competitor in the event of any competition being changed to a different time, day, or different arena.
